Valentine's Day originates from Catholic celebration of the death of two men executed by Claudius II, both named Valentine. Later the holiday gained its romantic theme when Pope Gelasius I combined Valentine's Day with Lupercalia, to overwrite pagan rituals.

Easter is celebrated by Christians as the third day of Jesus' resurrection but has even deeper roots as the pagan celebration of the Spring Equinox, and the Easter Bunny even has roots in German Lutherans as a figure that evaluated if the children were good or bad, like Santa Claus.

Labor Day originates from the Haymarket Riot in 1886, when labor activists fought for the recognition of American workers. Congress designated the day as a national holiday in 1894.
